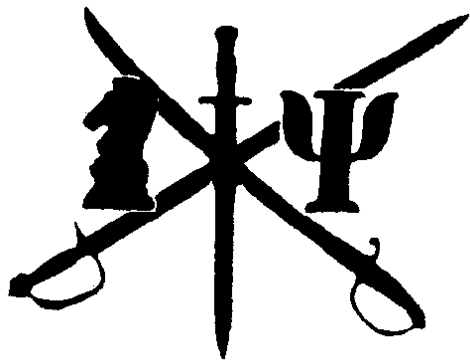


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Seven Ages of Man

"**All the world's a stage**" begins a monologue from William Shakespeare's *As You Like It*, spoken by the melancholy Jacques in Act II, Scene VII. The speech compares the world to a stage and life to a play, and catalogues the seven stages of a man's life, sometimes referred to as the **seven ages of man**:

Soldier (reputation, recognition)

Justice (wisdom, experience, prosperity, social status)

Old age (stature and personality diminish)
